Sustaining English

INFORMATION



Participants will travel to Tucumán, Argentina for two weeks in May. The group will work alongside students and educators at The Santa Rosa School to create plans and deliver well-rounded lessons.

The Santa Rosa School is dedicated to the education of its students and the generation of new knowledge. Participants will develop two-week lesson plans that they will present and utilize at the Santa Rosa School. 8 lesson plans will be developed for students in the Elementary School (ages 6-12), and 5 lesson plans will be developed for students in the Secondary School (ages 12-18).

GST 379: Sustaining English Teaching Practices

The trip will coincide with the spring course GST 379: Sustaining English Teaching Practices. This course focuses on the pedagogical experience of teaching English in an international environment and the role of teaching and learning English as a foreign language. Through this course, participants will learn about the four-skill model of foreign language learning based on the development of listening, speaking, reading, and writing competencies, allowing participants to develop the English Teaching Practices workshop content. While in Argentina, students will complete practicum hours and will receive feedback on their lesson implementation by Santa Rosa teachers.
